

LEARNER PRIVACY NOTICE

Realise Learning and Employment Limited (**Realise**) is committed to protecting the privacy and security of your personal information.

This privacy notice describes how we collect and use personal information about you during and after your course with us, in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). It applies to Realise Training Group and all subsidiaries and applies to all learners who use our training services.

For the purposes of the UK's Data Protection Act 2018, the data controller is Realise Training Group, Registered Office: First Floor, Cygnet House, 1 Jenkin Rd, Sheffield S9 1AT.

Data protection principles

We will comply with data protection law. This says that the personal information we hold about you must be:

- 1. Used lawfully, fairly and in a transparent way.
- 2. Collected only for valid purposes that we have clearly explained to you and not used in any way that is incompatible with those purposes.
- 3. Relevant to the purposes we have told you about and limited only to those purposes.
- 4. Accurate and kept up to date.
- 5. Kept only as long as necessary for the purposes we have told you about.
- 6. Kept securely.

The type of information we hold about you

Personal data, or personal information, means any information about an individual from which that person can be identified. It does not include data where the identity has been removed (anonymous data).

There are "special categories" of more sensitive personal data which require a higher level of protection.

We may collect, store, and use the following categories of personal information about you:

- Personal contact details such as name, title, addresses, telephone numbers, and personal email addresses
- · Date of birth.



- Gender.
- Next of kin and emergency contact information.
- National Insurance number.
- Qualifications
- Employment History

We may also collect, store and use the following "special categories" of more sensitive personal information:

- Information about your health, including any disability, medical condition
- Ethnicity

How we use your information

We will only use your personal information when the law allows us to. Most commonly, we will use your personal information in the following circumstances:

- 1. Where we need to perform the contract we have entered into with you.
- 2. Where we need to comply with a legal obligation.
- 3. Where it is necessary for our legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and your interest and fundamental rights do not override those interests.
- 4. Where we need to process certain sensitive data or offer other courses and learning opportunities with your consent

We may also use your personal information in the following situation, which are likely to be rare:

- 1. Where we need to protect your interest (or someone else's interest).
- 2. Where it is needed in the public interest or for official purposes.

Situations in which we will use your personal information

We need all the categories of information in the list above primarily to allow us to perform our contract with you [indicated by the letter A below] and to enable us to comply with legal obligations [indicated by the letter B below]. In some cases we may use your personal information to pursue legitimate interests of our own or those of third parties [indicated by the letter C below], provided your interests and fundamental rights do not override those interests. The situations in which we will process your personal information are listed below. We have indicated by [LETTER] the purpose or purposes for which we are processing or will process your personal information, as well as indicating which categories of data are involved.

- To enable Realise to comply with its duties contained in the learner agreement signed by you, your employer and Realise. [A] and/or [C]
- Checking you are legally entitled to work in the UK. [B]



- To plan, manage and deliver the training services to you [C]
- To enable REALISE to comply with our legal obligations to the Department for Education (**DfE**). [C]
- Checking prior learning and achievements contained in the Personal Learning Record (PLR). [C]

How we use particularly sensitive personal information

"Special categories" of particularly sensitive personal information require higher levels of protection. We need to have further justification for collecting, storing and using this type of personal information. We may process special categories of personal information in the following circumstances:

- 1. To process your ethnic origin and information about your health, including any disability and medical condition, to enable us to comply with reporting obligations we have with DfE.
- 2. Information about a disability may be requested to enable us to meet legal requirements under the Equality Act 2010.
- 3. Where it is needed in the public interest, such as for equal opportunities monitoring, and in line with our data protection policy.

Data Sharing

We may share your personal information with other organisations, being:

- our service providers who provide us with assistance in delivering the training services.
- those who regulate our provision of the training services such as the Department for Education, Ofsted and Awarding Organisations.

We will share your personal information with the DfE. The information you supply will be used by the DfE to issue you with a Unique Learner Number (**ULN**), and to create your Personal Learning Record. We may share your personal information with third parties where required by law, where it is necessary to administer the working relationship with you or where we have another legitimate interest in doing so.

People Appearing On CCTV

Data retention

How long will you use my information for?

We will only retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. To determine the appropriate retention period for personal data, we consider the amount, nature, and sensitivity of the personal data, the potential risk of harm from unauthorised use or disclosure of your personal data, the purposes for which we process your personal data and whether we can achieve those purposes through other means, and the applicable legal requirements.

Automated decision making

We do not make decisions that would have a significant effect based solely on automated decision-making processes.

Data Security

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal information to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need to know. They will only process your personal information on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected data security breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected breach where we are legally required to do so.

Your rights

Rights of access, correction, erasure, and restriction

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:



- Request access to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- Request correction of the personal information that we hold about you. This
 enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about
 you corrected.
- Request erasure of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to
 delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us
 continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove
 your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to
 processing (see below).
- **Data portability,** allows you to obtain and reuse your personal data for your own purposes across different services
- Object to processing of your personal information where we are relying on a
 legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your
 situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You
 also have the right to object where we are processing your personal
 information for direct marketing purposes.
- Request the restriction of processing of your personal information. This
 enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information
 about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason
 for processing it.
- Request the transfer of your personal information to another party.
- Withdraw Consent In limited circumstances, where you have provided consent to the collection, processing or transfer of your personal information for a specific purpose, you have the right to withdraw your consent at a later date. Once we have received notification that you wish to withdraw your consent, we will cease processing your information for that specific purpose unless we have another legitimate or statutory basis for continuing to do so. You will be told if we are unable to cease processing your information and why.

If you want to review, verify, correct or request erasure of your personal information, object to the processing of your personal data, or request that we transfer a copy of your personal information to another party, please contact us.

What We Need from You

Tell Us When Your Details Change

To assist us in ensuring the accuracy of your personal data, it is important that you tell us if your personal information changes.



Verification of Identity

We will need to request specific information from you to help us confirm your identity and ensure your right to access your personal data (or exercise any of your other rights). This is an appropriate security measure to ensure that personal information is not disclosed to a person who has no right to receive it.
